It is 4th May, 1699. The Antelope is going to the Far East.




There are a lot of waves. The ship and the other men disappear under the water. Gulliver swims and swims.





Finally, Gulliver arrives at a beach. He cannot see any houses. He is very tired and he goes to sleep.






The man is about 15 centimetres tall. He is looking at Gulliver. Gulliver is very surprised.







There are hundreds of little men. They have got bows and arrows. They speak a strange language.




Gulliver is very hungry. He is very thirsty too.




But the little men do not understand Gulliver. He moves his hand up and down. Finally, his hand is free. He points to his mouth.




Now the little men understand. They give Gulliver meat, bread, fruit and milk. Gulliver is happy.




Gulliver goes to sleep again. The little men take him to the city. They need more than 1000 horses!




Gulliver stands up. He can see a city, trees and mountains. Everything is very small.




One day the emperor visits Gulliver. He speaks to Gulliver, but Gulliver does not understand the emperor.




One day Gulliver asks the emperor a question.



They tell the emperor what is in Gulliver's pockets.




Gulliver is free now. He visits the city. The children play with him in the streets. Gulliver is very happy.



It's a country. The people of Blefuscu are bad.


